# MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS SEPTEMBER 29, 2014 AT 7:00 P.M.

He said he believed in reserves and volunteered for the Spring Branch School District and they have reserves. He also asked if City Council had looked at possibly lowering the debt rate.

Don Sumners of 1726 Creek Drive, questioned council and asked how many of the residents know of the proposed tax rate increase. He advised council not to go forward with the proposed tax rate.

Jim Rockwell of 11726 Flintwood, asked if the bonds the city has today are at fixed rate.

Mrs. Smith of 222 Stoney Creek Drive, said she had not been aware of the proposed tax increase.

Mayor Williams closed the public hearing at 7:52 p.m.
