# MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS OCTOBER 12, 2018 AT 12:00 P.M.

## I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Williams called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 11977 Memorial Drive, Houston, Texas

## II. PUBLIC COMMENT

Speakers are required to address council at the microphone and give their name and address prior to voicing their concerns.

Note: To comply with provisions of the Open Meetings Act, the City Council may not deliberate on items discussed under this agenda item. Items that cannot be referred to the city staff for action may be placed on the agenda of a future City Council meeting.

Ms. Kelly Dempsey resides at 246 Tamerlaine addressed the Mayor and Council about the Village Fire Department and response times. Ms. Dempsey stated that she has lived in Bunker Hill for 46 years and had several occasions where she needed the Village Fire Department. She was very happy with the response she received.

Mrs. Audrey Maclean at 259 Tamerlaine Drive stated the she and her neighbors had concerns about Bunker Hill leaving the Village Fire Department. Mrs. Maclean stated that she felt the response time from Village Fire was fabulous and does not want to go to Houston.

Mrs. Martha Matiuk resides at 235 Tamerlaine Drive reported that she had used Village Fire and that she experienced a short response time.

# III. CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE ACTION IN RESPONSE TO THE VILLAGE FIRE COMMISSION'S OCTOBER 4, 2018 LETTER IMPROPERLY ATTEMPTING TO REMOVE BUNKER HILL FROM THE VILLAGE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Mayor Williams stated that he had met with several of the Mayors and the Fire Commission Chairman to discuss the opportunity for a "Stand Still Agreement" as suggested by Mayor Mark

Kobelan of Piney Point. This would allow some time to gather more information, work through the issues and hopefully, negotiate a solution.
