


Bunker Hill Elementary School

Reconstruction in 2021 − 2022 ★ New School to Open in Fall 2022



Bunker Hill Elementary School located at 11950 Taylorcrest is scheduled for reconstruction per the District's approved 2017 Bond Referendum. *Students will remain on campus during the construction of the new building*. The construction will begin in January 2021 after the Holiday Break. Thank you for your support and understanding as we work through the construction process and welcome students to the new building in 2022! Here are some renderings of the new building, an aerial view and the site layout planned for the reconstructed campus.







Phase 1 of the Project will begin with the construction of the north entrance and a new west drive. This will accommodate the stacking of carpool for the new school. This is expected to take 4 - 5 months (2021 Spring Semester) to be completed. The City has given permission to work weekends to expedite this schedule.

Village Fire Station Reconstruction



The Village Fire Department Fire Station located at 901 Corbindale Road is currently under reconstruction. You may have noticed the tents and temporary facilities that have been moved to the site to provide temporary housing for EMS and Firefighters and to provide protection for equipment. The initial station was constructed 40 years ago for a shift of 6 firefighters. Today, each shift has a minimum of 10 firefighter/parametics and up to 13. The Department will host an Open House when completed. Please note, there will be no change in responding to your needs during this construction.

City Staff has been working with our website consultant in analyzing our website data to see our highest uses and are working to upgrade the website to make it easier to navigate and find your needs.

Although we love to see you, handling payments and permits online is much more efficient and secure.

We are also working to install a new mailbox/dropbox at City Hall where you can drive up and drop off payments or paperwork without getting out of your car. This new mailbox will also highlight and display a typical "secure" mailbox that can be installed at your home to avoid mail theft.

We should launch the new website and have the mailbox ready in early 2021! (we will send a vlinc when ready so make sure you register and/or update your information!)

Public Servant of the Year

Ray Schultz has been a leader in our City as Chief of Police for the Memorial Villages Police Department since 2017. Chief Schultz has been our voice to the Community, sharing information through his weekly emails and his reports during emergencies. Chief Schultz works closely with the City, especially in 2020 as we endured the pandemic and prepared for the above average number of hurricanes in the gulf. Chief Schultz has the heart of a public servant and has been an asset to the City during his 5-year tenure with the Department.

Resident Jack Christiansen

Volunteer of the Year

Jack Christiansen has lived in Bunker Hill Village since 1993 and has been our busiest volunteer in 2020 serving on both the City's Drainage Committee and the Planning and Zoning Commission. The Drainage Committee has been consistently meeting by Zoom even during the pandemic, making recommendations to the City Council on key drainage projects and ordinances. Mr. Christiansen serves as the Drainage Committee Chairman. The Planning and Zoning also had a busy Zoom year with two Specific Use Permits being processed which included workshops, public hearings, and recommendations to the City Council for ultimate approval. Both were ultimately approved with key provisions. Mr. Christiansen is instrumental in these roles with his dedication and level of detail on behalf of all residents.

In Memory of

William R. "Bill" Purifoy 1931 - 2020



The City Council, Staff and Residents lost a true friend with the death of Bill Purifoy in September 2020. Mr. Purifoy was rightly named the Resident of the Year for 2014 serving in a volunteer capacity with the City since 1993, serving under 7 different mayors.

Mr. Purifoy provided his strong work ethic, leadership, and professionalism in all of his volunteer efforts and earned the respect, admiration, and high regard of all those with whom he came into contact.

Mr. Purifoy began his volunteer service on the City's Board of Adjustment. He was then appointed to the Planning and Zoning Commission in 1999. Mr. Purifoy was also named the City's Election Judge in 2004 and served in that position until 2013.

Mr. Purifoy continued his service on the P&Z serving as Chairman until his passing in September. He led the P&Z through an extensive review of our development ordinances including zoning, subdivision, and our establishment of the new Chapter 4, Development, Building and Construction. Mr. Purifoy was on Zoom at the last P&Z Meeting in August.

The City will be installing a bench along Memorial Drive to honor and thank Mr. Bill Purifoy and his family.

Your 2021 Checklist:

Set Up Auto Pay by Credit Card or Bank Draft

We encourage residents to take advantage of automatic payments from your bank account or your credit card. Visit the website www.bunkerhilltx.gov and look for the green "Online Payrments" icon. It will take you to "Utility Bills" to set up your payment by credit card. If you prefer to use your bank account, go to "Citizen Services" – Utility Billing Auto Draft Request "Auto Draft" is secure, debits your account on the due date and ensures no late fees or cut offs. This can be very helpful as we bill every other month. Make sure you have your previous utility bill handy with your account information.

Sign Up or Update Your V-linc and Register Your Alarm

V-linc is the City's most effective means of communications with our residents and also serves as the way to register your alarm and share any special needs. Please take a few minutes and review your information so it will be up to date for the new year! The Police Chief and the City have used this throughout 2020 to share information regarding the pandemic, storms, City Council Meetings, and our newsletters. The Chief also sends a weekly email. (*The newsletter is also included hard copy with utility bills*). Please register your alarm and note any special circumstances.

There will be no trash services on Christmas Day or New Year's Day. However, Friday's normal pick up will be moved to Saturday on both weeks. Trash must be placed at the curb.

Normal trash will resume on Monday, January 4.

Texas Pride has informed us that Christmas **Trees can be placed curbside on any service day**; however, there will be a **special pick up for tree recycling on Saturday**, **January 9.** Trees must be placed at the curb/street and need to be clean of all stands, ornaments, and lights. **Flocked trees cannot be recycled.**

No Construction is allowed on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. Construction Activity is allowed; however, no inspections will be made on New Year's Eve, December 31.
