


# **Celebrating the Season**

## **Resident Resources**

Courtesy Tips as submitted by Residents and requested to be shared again

- Be mindful of the City's Good Neighbor, Noise and Construction Ordinances
- Enjoy "Back Door" Trash and Recycling Services during the Winter Months (Must be visible from the street and please do not place trash out too early if you put it at the curb)
- Do not blow grass into streets and especially no blowing or dumping into storm drains
- Please keep dogs on leashes, pick-up pet waste and dispose properly (Make use of the many Pet Waste stations!)
- Please shut off flood lights or lighting for tennis courts when not in use that overflow into your neighbor's yard/houses.
- Please share the path with walkers and bikers
- Please watch your vehicle speeds

### 2023 Checklist

Set Up Auto Pay by Credit Card or Bank Draft - We encourage residents to take advantage of automatic payments from your bank account credit card. Visit www.bunkerhilltx.gov and look for the green "Resident Services" tab. Select "Online Payments" to set up your payment or to access the "Auto Draft Request." "Auto Draft" is secure, debits your account on payment due date and ensures no late fees or cut offs. There are no extra charges to you or the City for bank drafts. Automatic payments can be very helpful as utilities are billed every other month. Make sure to have a prior utility bill for your address handy with your account information during sign-up. And if you set up by Credit Card, always ensure new cards are updated with new expiration dates.

**Update or Sign Up for V-linc and Register Your Alarm** – V-linc is the City and Police
Department's most effective means of timely
communications with our residents. This is also
the way to register your alarm and corresponding
information. The Police Chief and the City use Vlinc to communicate emergencies, inclement
weather, City Council Meetings, and City
newsletters. The Chief also sends a weekly report
using the information provided from the
registration.

Please take a few minutes and review your information so it will be up-to-date for 2023. Also, please register your alarm and note any special conditions that warrant attention.

### **Holiday Info**

**Trash** – There will *not* be any change or disruption for trash services over the holidays.

Christmas Tree Recycling – Christmas Trees may be placed curbside on any service day for pick-up by Texas Pride. There will be a special Christmas Tree Pick Up on Saturday, January 7, 2023. Trees must be cleaned of all stands, ornaments, and lights. Flocked trees cannot be recycled.

Construction / Contractors / Lawn Services – No activity is allowed on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. Inspections will continue on business days over the holidays; however, **no** inspections will be performed on two business days-Monday, December 26 and Monday, January 2.
