From the Mayor

Dear Residents -

The first quarter of the new year is proving to be very busy – and very successful – with the completion or near completion of several multi-year capital improvement projects throughout the City.

Chapel Belle and Tamerlaine Reconstruction — The Chapel Belle Project was designed in 2021 and constructed in 2022; The project included new underground drainage and complete reconstruction of the street. The Tamerlaine project improved existing drainage and replacement of cracked/uneven street panels. We certainly appreciate the patience and understanding of residents during both successful and under budget projects.

Water Well No. 5 – The City again successfully partnered with Spring Branch ISD ("SBISD") in drilling the new water well (a remarkable 1,200 feet in depth), installing a transmission line to the Taylorcrest Water Plant and all needed site work and controls. This well provides added resiliency to the City's water supply for years to come. The water well has been successfully tested and has been placed in service. The installation of landscaping around the well is substantially complete and scheduled to be completed within the next 4-6 weeks (pending vegetation availability and favorable weather). This project also appears to be under budget (depending on final numbers from our partner--SBISD).

Public Works and Disaster Operations Building – Construction of the City's new Public Works and Disaster Operations Building is under way. The project will provide a new facility for Public Work staff, additional storage, a much needed refresh of the exterior of City Hall (after enduring 30+ years of Houston weather) and serve as the Emergency Operations Center, as needed. The new building ensures a workspace for current & future staff and supports the continuing delivery of a high-quality level of service for all residents.

I am proud to share that 2023 brings a couple of changes to City leadership. This year will mark a distinguished milestone for City Administrator Karen Glynn's career with the City as she will be retiring this Spring (unselfishly allowing for a seamless transition of responsibilities) after ten years of service. After a nationwide search, City Council has appointed Gerardo Barrera as the new City Administrator. I, along with Council, am confident that he will continue to uphold – and strengthen – our City Mission and core values. I also welcome Village Fire Department (VFD) Interim Fire Chief Howard Miller. Chief Miller has served VFD – and our City – as a dynamic leader for more than 40 years and has the full support of our outstanding fire medics who provide amazing service to all of the Villages. 
His priorities are to serve the City's residents with the help from staff, servant leadership, exceptional customer service, and responsible financial management.
